FISH AND FISH PRODUCTS

TOTAL

THE MARKETED VALUE OF ALL FISH, FISH PRODUCTS AND MAMMALS CAUGHT AND LANDED IN BRITISH COLUMBIA IN 1955 TOTALLED \$60,668,000. This was down over 9 million dollars from the previous year's value. The TOTAL CORRESPONDING LANDED VALUE IN 1955 WAS \$28,330,000 AS COMPARED WITH \$35,044,000 IN 1954.

THESE FIGURES DO NOT INCLUDE THE VALUE OF HALBBUT CAUGHT MY BRITISH COLUMBIA FISHERMEN AND LANDED IN ALASKA OR THE MARKETED VALUE OF TURA CANNED BY BRITISH COLUMBIA COMPANIES FROM FROZEN TURA IMPORTED FROM JAPAN.

THE DECLINE IN TOTAL VALUE OF LANDINGS AND MARKETING CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO TWO FACTORS.

FIRSTO THE TOTAL CATCH OF SALMON WAS THE LOWEST SINCE 1944 AND TOTALLED ONLY 131.0 MILLION POUNDS. THE REDUCED CATCHES OF CHUMS (1/3 OF NORMAL) COUPLED WITH DISAPPOINTING SOCKEYE RUNS MORE THAN OFFSET THE SECOND HIGHEST PINK CATCH ON RECORD.


Second. The Halibut catch in 1955 declined 5 million founds from 1954 production and was the Lowest since 1950.

THE HERBING CATCH WAS ALSO DOWN SHARPLY IN 1955. THE DECLINE CAN BE ATTRIBUTED IN PART TO THE HERRING FISHING STRIKE THAT OCCURRED BETWEEN JULY AND NOVEMBER AND ALSO TO EASELIER THAN USUAL CLOSING OF THE HERRING FISHING IN FERRUARY 1955, DUE TO ABSENCE OF LARGE BODIES OF HERRING.

THE VIELD OF OIL IN 1955 WAS HIGHER PER TON THAN IN 1954 AND THIS COUPLED WITH HIGHER UNIT PRICES FOR BOTH MEAL AND OIL RESULTED IN THE MARKETED VALUE FOR HERRING PRODUCTION IN 1955 BEING ONLY SLIGHTLY LESS THAN REPORTED IN 1954.

The only disruption in fishing effort in 1955 was that in the Herring Fishery already referred to in a preceding paragraph.

THE MARKETED VALUE OF SALMON IN 1955 TOTALLED 42,869,000, 15% LESS THAN IN 1954. SALMON REPRESENTED 70.7% OF THE TOTAL MARKETED VALUE OF ALL FISH IN 1955.

VALUE OF CANNED SALMON PRODUCTION IN 1955 WAS 32.7 MILLION DOLLARS OR 5.7 MILLION LESS THAN THE PREVIOUS YEAR WHILE FRESH SALES WERE DOWN NEARLY 2 MILLION DOLLARS AS A RESULT OF THE POOR CHUM SALMON RUN WHICH USUALLY ARE EXPORTED EXTENSIVELY TO THE UNITED STATES TO BE USED FOR CANNING

MARKETING OF FRESH COHO AND SPRING SALMON DECLINED 15% IN 1955 BUT UNIT PRICES WERE HIGHER THAN IN 1954 AND AS A RESULT THE VALUE OF MARKETINGS WERE THE SAME AS 1954.

FROZEN SALMON FILLET PRODUCTION IN 1955 WAS APPROXIMATELY 792,000 POUNDS AS COMPARED WITH 1,440,000 POUNDS IN 1954. PRODUCTION OF SALMON EGGS, ROE AND CAVIAR WHICH IN RECENT YEARS HAS BEEN SHOWING AN UPWARD TREND IN PRODUCTION, DROPPED OFF SHARPLY AND IN 1955 WAS VALUED AT ONLY \$81,000 AS COMPARED WITH \$240,000 IN 1954.

THE CANNED SALMON PACK IN 1955 TOTALLED 1,406,100 CASES VALUED AT \$32,611,000 BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE SPECIALTY CANNED SALMON PACKS VALUED AT \$53,500.

THE SOCKEYE PACK OF 244, 821 CASES WAS THE LOWEST SINCE 1943 WHILE THE PINK PACK OF 831,253 CASES WAS THE SECOND HIGHEST ON RECORD AND WAS EXCEEDED ONLY BY THE 1930 PACK WHEN 1,112,000 CASES WERE CANNED.

HERRING

LANDING OF HERRING IN 1955 TOTALLED 152,850 TONS, A DECLINE OF MORE THAN 28,000 TONS OR NEARLY 16% FROM 1954 LANDINGS. AS USUAL MOST OF THIS PRODUCTION WAS UTILIZED IN OIL AND MEAL PRODUCTS. PRICES FOR BOTH MEAL AND OIL WERE HIGHER IN 1955 THAN IN 1954 AND AS A RESULT THE MARKETED VALUE \$7,323,000 ALMOST EQUALLED 1954°S VALUE.

HALIBUT

LANDING OF HALIBUT BY CANADIAN FISHERMEN IN B. C. PORTS IN 1955 WAS LOWEST SINCE 1950 AND TOTALLED 19.68 MILLION POUNDS. BOTH LANDED AND MARKET PRICES WERE ALSO LOWER THAN 1954 WITH THE RESULT THAT THE TOTAL MARKETED VALUE OF HALIBUT DECLINED 2 MILLION DOLLARS FROM \$5,965,000 TO 3,924,000.

SOLES

IN 1955 SOLE LANDINGS INCREASED AND REVERSED THE DOWNWARD TREND THAT HAS BEEN DEVELOPING IN RECENT YEARS. THE TOTAL MARKETED VALUE IN 1955 WAS \$710,000 AN INCREASE OF 54% OVER THE \$461,000 REPORTED IN 1954. PRODUCTION OF FRESH FILLETS DURING THE YEAR TOTALLED 694,300 POUNDS AND FROZEN FILLETS 1,343,600 POUNDS.

CRAB AND SHRIMP

Marketed values for crab and shrimp continued to increase and in 1955 the marketed value reached a New High of \$1,277,000 of which \$996,000 was realized for crabs and \$281,000 for shrimp.

OTHER SPECIES

Other species of importance to the B.C. Fishing in order of their marketed value in 1955 were as follows with 1954 values shown in brackets. Gray Cod \$444,800 (\$467,000), Clams \$436,100 (\$306,000), Oysters \$420,000, Ling Cod \$399,200 (\$487,800) and Black Cod \$265.300 (\$257,300). Of increasing importance is the mink feed market and in 1955 total sales of fish for this purpose totalled \$330,900 an increase of 125 per cent over the previous year.

BOATS

in 1955 the commercial fishing fleet in B. C. totalled 8194 boats valued at \$42,500,000. Of the total 950 were 10 tons or more while 7,244 were in the less than 10 ton classification.

IN THE OVER 10 TON CLASS, 766 WERE DIESEL POWERED, WHILE 184 HAD GASOLINE ENGINES.

GILLNET VESSELS MADE UP THE HIGHEST PERCENTAGE OF THE UNDER 10 TON BOATS AND A TOTAL OF 3,476 MOTORIZED GILLNETS WERE REPORTED WITH AN ESTIMATED VALUE OF \$9,444,000. GAS AND DIESEL POWERED TROLLERS TOTALLED 2,389 VALUED AT \$5,424,000.

IN ADDITION THERE WERE 434 BOATS CLASSIFIED AS OTHER THAT INCLUDED COMBINATION GAS AND DIESEL VESSELS.

LAST YEAR FOR THE FIRST TIME INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE IN THE ACTUAL NUMBER OF FISHERMEN TAKING OUT FISHING LICENSES. THIS SHOWED THAT A TOTAL OF 11,860 PERSONS TOOK OUT LICENSES, BUT THIS TOTAL DOES NOT INCLUDE 976 MEN ENGAGED IN OTHER PHASES OF THE FISHING OPERATION SUCH AS PACKING, COLLECTING, CREW OF WHALERS ETC.

GEAR & EQUIPMENT

THE BASIS FOR DETERMINING THE VALUE OF GEAR AND EQUIPMENT IN THE FISHING INDUSTRY WAS CHANGED IN 1955 AND THE UNITS AND VALUES SHOWN ARE INTENDED TO SHOW THE NUMBER AND VALUE OF EACH TYPE OF GEAR AND EQUIPMENT AT THE END OF THE YEAR.

This inventory showed a total value of gear and equipment in the primary industry on hand as of December 31, 1955 as worth \$7,840,000.

Salmon gillnets totalled 6,647 worth \$2,487,000 while 504 salmon purse seines are valued at \$1,715,000. Herring purse seine totalled 92 with an estimated appraised value of \$955,000.

Troll gear was valued at \$305,000 while long line gear is shown as worth \$370,000 and crab traps TOTALLED \$165,000.

This year private or company owned fishermen floats, net racks and bluestone equipment has been included in the value of primary equipment and was valued at \$593,000. Buying scows and barges totalled 184 and were valued at \$780,600.
