SUMMARY OF FISHERIES STATISTICS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA - 1965

Total Value of Fish Products

For 1965, the wholesale market value of fish, whale, hair seal, and liver products amounted to 84.7 million dollars, compared with 92.1 million dollars in 1964.

The value of salmon products amounted to 52 million dollars, other species including whales nearly 32 million dollars, and vitamin products \$9,000.

These values do not include:

- the value of halibut landed by B.C. fishermen at United States ports in Washington and Alaska, which amounted to 7,190,000 pounds valued at \$2,413,000 in 1965.
- the value of tuna imported and processed in B.C.

Among the factors influencing production and the market year were:

- (1) Salmon landings of 90 million pounds compared with 124 million pounds in 1964.
- (2) A canned pack of only 913,957 cases, nearly 350,000 cases lower than in 1964. Coho production was at record high level but pinks were weak and the chum pack at 65,000 cases was lowest since 1931.
- (3) The wholesale value of B.C. halibut at 10.2 million dollars was more than two million dollars above 1964.
- (4) Herring production of over 220,000 tons and a record market level of over 11.7 million dollars.

SALMON

The wholesale value of all salmon products dropped to 52.1 million dollars in 1965, compared with 63.0 million dollars in 1964. The canned pack of 913,957 cases was valued at 35.1 million dollars.

The sockeye pack of 245,798 cases was valued at 12.8 million dollars, down from 18.1 million dollars in 1964. Sockeye comprised of 3% of the value of the total canned pack. The value of all sockeye products amounted to 12.9 million dollars.

The wholesale value of all coho products established a new high at 19.3 million dollars, compared to last year's record of 16.4 million dollars. The canned pack totalled 295,284 cases, valued at 11.7 million dollars or 59% of the total product value.

The pink salmon pack of nearly 238,000 cases was well below 1963's cycle year pack of 757,000 cases. Consequently the wholesale value of 9 million dollars for all pink salmon products was less than half the 18.6 million dollars level of 1963 and lower, too, than 1964's 12.6 million dollars.

The pack of chum salmon was only 65,000 cases and was valued at 1.6 million dollars compared to 233,000 cases packed in 1964. The wholesale value for all chum salmon products totalled 2.3 million dollars.

The total canned pack of 913,957 cases was 341,351 cases below the 1964 total of 1,255,308 cases and 8.6 million dollars lower in value.

HERRING

The herring fishery declined slightly in volume at 222,000 tons. Herring meal and oil dropped accordingly but with higher unit values the wholesale value of herring products rose to \$11,752,000, slightly higher than the previous all-time high of 1963.

Oil and meal production continued to dominate the marketing as other product forms remained insignificant.

HALIBUT

British Columbia fishermen landed 25.8 million pounds of halibut in B.C. ports, compared with 25.1 million pounds in 1964. Landings by Canadian boats at U.S. ports declined about 1 million pounds to 7.2 million pounds.

Unit prices at an average of 33.7¢ per pound exceeded the previous record high of 31.7¢ in 1962, and was some 9¢ higher than in 1964. The wholesale market value of B.C. landings totalled 10.2 million dollars compared with 8.0 million dollars in 1964.

GREY COD

Grey cod established a new record of landings at 19 million pounds, about 7 million pounds higher than reported in 1964. The wholesale value of grey cod products rose to 1.8 million dollars compared with 1.2 million dollars last year. Chief disposition was in frozen forms.

CRAB & SHRIMP

Shrimp landings increased sharply and totalled 1,755,000 pounds valued at \$281,000 compared with slightly over a million pounds last year and a landed value of \$161,000. Wholesale product values for shrimps, mainly fresh and frozen meat, increased accordingly to \$596,000.

Crab landings were lower at 3,501,000 pounds with a landed value of \$552,000. The wholesale value of crab products fell from \$1,439,000 last year to \$1,144,000 in 1965. Of this total, 4,974 cases of canned crabs contributed \$325,000.

This inventory was not carried out in 1965. In 1966 and in subsequent years this table will be based on information obtained by means of the Commercial fishing vessel registration system introduced in 1966.

GEAR & EQUIPMENT (Table 5)

Valuation on the inventory of gear, taken at the year-end, amounted to \$11,281,000 compared with \$10,711,000 in 1964.
